This periodical publishes articles on theoretical, empirical and applied research in the field of social, humanities and technical sciences.

Manuscripts are accepted in Lithuanian, English, German, Polish and Russian.

The issues are released not less than two times a year. One issue of the periodical will contain the publications on social science and humanities, while the other will cover the technologies, agriculture, biomedicine and physical sciences. Additional thematic periodical issues can be also published.

It is intended that “Homo-Societas-Technologiae” is made available in the international research information data base.

The periodical is formatted A5. It will also be issued in CD format and be available on the Internet website www.marko.lt as well as in PDF format and in 10th printed issue format.

INFORMATION TO AUTHORS:

Articles in the field of Social Sciences and Humanities should be submitted to Divisions s of Humanities and Social Sciences.

Articles in the field of Technologies, Agriculture, Biomedicine and Physical Sciences should be submitted to the Divisions of Technologies, Agriculture, Physical Sciences and Biomedicine.

Requirements for the Articles to be published

Work submitted for publication must be original, authentic, previously unpublished, and not under consideration for publication elsewhere.

Work submitted for publication is accepted in the following languages: Lithuanian, English, German, Russian or Polish. The material prepared in Lithuanian will be edited at the Editorial Board.

One copy of the prepared material to be submitted to the Editorial Board must be written using the computer programme, in A4 format, on one-sided paper and E-version (CD or USB memory-stick), *Windows, WinWord editing*). Page number position is Right Bottom. The size of the article of pages may vary from 8 within 16, A4 format, 1 (*Single*) interval.

All manuscripts are subject to review by two doctoral degree reviewers appointed by the Editorial Board.

Submission of a paper to the Editorial Board implies that the-to be- published material should contain the elements listed bellow in the following order:

- Author's Name, Last name. In case there is more than one author, they must be included in the alphabetical order, if their input into writing the article is equivalent. In case of non-equivalence, the first should be the author whose input into writing the article is the uppermost.
- Author affiliation.
- Title of the article.
- Abstract in the Lithuanian language (approximately up to 600 printed characters).
- Keywords in Lithuanian (up to 5 main notions). If the article is in another language than Lithuanian, the abstract or keywords should not be necessary.
- Introduction that contains the formulated research problem, the description of its relevance to the subject matter and the description of the research, the presentation of the research object, aims and the objectives, the research methodology and the methods and, if necessary, the hypothesis.
- Body of the article in which the results and the analysis of the theoretical and/or empiric research are presented. The body must be divided into thematic sections.
- Conclusions.
- List of the cited references that appeared in the text.
- The title of the article in English.
- The author's name and last name/surname.
- Summary in English (no longer than 600 printed characters).
- Keywords in English (not more than 5 main notions).

The following data about the author should be presented separately:

Data about the author: Name, Last name/surname, scientific title and the title referring to a research field/trend. Institution, research interests and the field (-s), contact information (E-mail address, telephone number). The latter information should be given in Lithuanian and in English. The data mentioned afore about the author will be presented at the end of the issue. The information about the authors (Email address, telephone number) may be available with the agreement of the authors.

Requirements for Article Formatting

Normal text should be Font *Times New Roman*. When setting margins, please use A4 sized paper (21x29.7 cms), page setting Top and Bottom 2 cm, Left 3 cm, Right 2 cm.

- Author's/Authors' name and last name/surname in small letters, 12 pt, **Bold**, *Center*. In case of more than one author, the names should be punctuated by comma.
- Author affiliated institution 12 pt, *Italic*, *Center*.
- Title of the article 14 pt, **Bold**, *Center*, in capital letters.
- Author, the affiliated institution and its name 1, 5 spaced.
- Abstract and keywords 10 pt, *Single-spaced*, *Regular* font. Notional concepts in the Abstract and Keywords **Bold**.
- Text is printed 12 pt, *Single-spaced*. There should be indentation at the beginning of a paragraph (1,27 cm).
- Titles of Introduction, sections and sub-sections 12 pt, Regular Font, in capital letters, Left aligned, identified consecutively by Arabic numbers.
- The sub-titles contained in the Introduction *Research relevance*, *Research problem*, *Research object*, *Research aim*, *Research objects*, *Research methods*, *Research hypothesis*, *Research methodology* are to be written in *Italics*.
- Personal names and place names, if not Lithuanian, are written in the original (e.g., English, Russian, French, German and Polish).

- Tables are 10 pt, *Single*-spaced, captioned and consecutively identified by Arabic numbers, for example, Table 1, Table 2, etc. The numbering and captions should appear at the top of each the table, right aligned, in 11 pt, *Regular* font.
- Pictures, figures and charts are numbered and captioned titled: numbers and titles are placed under the picture/chart, written in 11 pt, *Center, Regular*.
- Formulae are written *Center* and identified by Arabic numbers that are aligned on the right of the text. For example:

$$s = v \cdot t, \quad (1)$$

here s – distance m;
 v – speed m/s;
 t – time s.

A single formula should not be identified by a number.

- References to the cited sources/ used in the text are placed at the page bottom, Times New Roman, 10 pt. If it is necessary, the commentaries/explanations of the text are placed in the analogous way. The references are in the following order-author's last name, the first initial of the name, the title of the publication/article, place of publication, publisher, year and page. The author's last name is separated by comma. The other data are punctuated by full stops, the main publication is written in *Italics*. If a reference made to an article in a book/journal, follows the year of publishing and the number (in case it is presented), the comma as a means of punctuation is further followed by a page number. The small letter 'p' is included immediately after the page numbers in the Lithuanian references, e.g., Beresnevičius, G. Suprasti religiją // *Kultūra ir religija*. Sud.Juknevičius, S.Vilnius. Valstybinis leidybos centras.1995, 311-330 p. If the reference is cited in a foreign language (if not in the Latin alphabet, for example, Slavic), the title of the publication should be written in the original and the first initial (S, P, C, etc.) should precede the page number. For example, Berger, P.L. *Sehnsucht nach Sinn. Glauben in einer Zeit der Leichtgläubigkeit*. Frankfurt/New York. Campus Verlag. 1994, S. 38. If there is a publication with a single editor, the first is the headline that is followed by the symbol /, the name of the editor is written in the original (last name and the 1st initial of the name, separated by comma), e.g., *Oxford Dictionary of Sociology* / Ed by Marshall, G. NY. Oxford University Press. 1998. Theological, Church documents and Scriptures are cited in conformation with the usual requirements for this type of the publications, for example, 1 Kor 2, 5; KBK 2568. If the article in an electronic or printed periodical is referred to, the requirements are in the following order: the author's last name, the first initial of the name, the title of the publication and the internet source, e.g., Clark, L.Sh. *Exploring the Role of Media in Religious Identity-construction Among Teens* // Internet address: <http://www.religion-online.org/showarticle.asp?title=223> [Accessed 02.06.2012.] References in Russian are written in the original in accordance with the above mentioned description, e.g., Мид, Дж. От жеста к символу // *Американская социологическая мысль*. Москва. МГУ. 1994, с. 215-224; *Мистика. Религия. Наука. Классики мирового религиоведения. Антология*. Москва. Канон. 1998.
- If more than one reference to the same source occurs on the same page, the following phrase is to be used: See page O and the number of the page are identified.
- If a part of the reference is omitted, the omitted part is presented by the following symbols <...>
- References should be listed and identified as the List of References is presented in alphabetical order in concordance with the bibliographical requirements, 10 pt, Single- spaced. The references written in the Latin alphabet are followed by the references in the Cirylic alphabet. Internet sources are placed at the end of the list. The keyword in the list (main publication) is written in *Italics*.
- Summary in English or Lithuanian (if the article is not in Lithuanian); the title of the article is in English, 12 pt, Regular (if the article is not in Lithuanian, the title should be written in Lithuanian),

the author's name and surname, the heading 'Summary', Summary (not more than 600 printed characters and keywords. The title of the article is written in capital letters.
